

## St George's School Pupil Premium Strategy Statement 2017-18.

The Pupil Premium Grant provides funding for the following students:

- Students currently in receipt of free school meals (FSM) - £935 per student
- Who have been in receipt of free school meals during the past 6 years (Ever 6) - £935 per student
- Who have been continuously looked after for the past 6 months - £1600 per student
- Who are adopted from care under the Adoption and Children Act 2002 or who have left care under a Special Guardianship or Residence Order - £1900 per student
- Students whose families serve in the armed forces - £935

The money is delegated to the school and the purpose of the grant is to raise the attainment of students who are eligible and to ensure they make progress in line with their peers.

St George's School is committed to providing effective resources to ensure that all students get appropriate support and access to a meaningful curriculum. Our main objective is to close any gap in attainment and progress for vulnerable students.

Pupil Premium for looked after students is managed by the Virtual School and is allocated on a termly basis. The Virtual school have made the decision to hold £300 per looked after student centrally.

Individualised plans are created for all students eligible for pupil premium funding.

The table below outlines the proposed pupil premium spend for 2017-18.
